Nomination Forms are being sent out again for the <u>Annual General Meeting</u> on Tuesday 8 August 2017. There are only nine positions and a few forms have already been submitted, so be quick.

We encourage new members to volunteer for either committee or non-committee jobs. It is a great way to become involved and there will be plenty of guidance from experienced members.

There are fewer visitors at Narooma Visitor Centre at present so this is a good time of the year to start as a volunteer and learn the job during the quiet time. Remember, there is always one trained staff member on duty so the volunteer duties are largely meet-and-greet. That first "Hello, can I help you with anything" (and the special Narooma-smile that goes with it) are often the first impression visitors have of Narooma.

The <u>PCYC Children's Art Program</u> for Primary School-aged children starts on Thursday 20 July at the Cottage-Studio. The classes are at 4.15pm for one hour, and the PCYC tutor will always be in attendance. Some MACS members have already volunteered to be tutors and a few more would be welcome.

Would a member like to volunteer to mind the Cottage-Studio on <u>Tuesday mornings</u>. If you can do a shift even each fortnight that would be great. All other times are covered, mostly by groups working in the studio.

MACS is now having exhibitions in several different venues so the Committee discussed the idea of making all exhibitions consistently and recognisably linked to MACS. Therefore publicity materials using the <u>"paint drips"</u> <u>logo</u> will be used for all MACS exhibitions. Templates have been prepared for DL leaflets, A4 and A3 posters, so it will be easy to adapt them to each exhibition.
