### From the Committee

The next General Meeting is at 4.15pm on <u>Tuesday 16 May</u> at the cottage studio. Do come and have your say.

The Annual General Meeting will be in August. We encourage new members to volunteer for jobs. It is a great way to become involved and there will be plenty of guidance from experienced members. If you are considering volunteering for the 2017-2018 Committee, you are invited to the next Committee Meeting at 4.15pm on Tuesday 23 May to see how it works.

The Department of Fair Trading has revised the Model Constitution so the Committee is reviewing MACS Constitution to bring it in line. Any changes will be brought to a General Meeting of MACS members for approval.

MACS has been managing the Visitor Centre for one year and has been able to fund projects from each of the three schools, as well as paying for storage for exhibition equipment. From Monday 1 May the Visitor Centre opening hours will go to off-season times of 9am to 4pm. Volunteers at the Centre are always welcome.

The Cottage Studio Roster is now filled on weekdays, and there are working groups morning and afternoon every day except Friday afternoon.

Margaret Moran's *Watercolour* course for Term 2 is booked out and the forms are available for the *Pastel* course in Term 3.

For the time being, the Cottage opening hours will be Monday to Friday 10am to 4pm. On Saturdays and Sundays the Cottage is closed to the public but still available for members' use.

The Library at the Cottage will, for the time being, be operating on an honour system unless a member would like to volunteer to oversee it.
