Visitor Centre

The Gallery at the Narooma Visitor Centre features many of our artists and is a great example of the talented people who live in our region. Sales over Christmas period were very good amounting to over \$2,500 and for March around \$1,300 (at time of writing figures for March not finalized. Overall we average above \$1,200 a month in sales and at only 20% commission rate this is a very real benefit to our MACS Members. Add to this that artists do not have to sit and it really is very attractive to be a MACS Member.

However, that doesn't mean we don't need help out, our contract with volunteers to Eurobodalla Council gives us an allowance for paid staff for 42 hours per week. That is just one person at a time and volunteers are needed as support to allow time for paid staff to take a break or have lunch and then there is the peak season with many visitors to our levely town. Thanks to those of our regulars who give their time, we always need more people as some of us are into caravans, camping, grandchildren, cruising etc. In other words most of us are retired and want to spend our leisure time doing all sorts of things. So we need a constant stream of volunteers for as much or as little time as you have in between your other amazing activities.

Tell your friends and visitors that the Visitor Centre has a really good range of unique items and interesting gifts for that special person, namely you when they stay in your house (just kidding).

I enjoy my volunteer time in the Visitor Centre, it is rare that I don't learn something about Narooma I didn't know that morning. We have all sorts of people coming into our town you would be amazed how many Europeans visit they are around 20% of our total visitors. Just think as a volunteer you might get the opportunity to drag out that school girl French you learned or German or Spanish and many more.

Any time you have available would be helpful and it is good fun with nice people. Kris
