# **President's Report**

It was good to see so many members attend the General Meeting of MACS on Friday 26 July. The discussion centered on the upcoming change from a sub-lease with Narooma Mens' Shed to directly leasing Building 3

(the Studio) from Macauley Family Investments Pty Ltd (Landlords) as from 1<sup>st</sup> October. This means MACS will have sole access and use of the building every day of the week.

These are outcomes from the meeting.

#### Removal of MACS items from Building 2

Building 2 due for extensive repairs and will be no longer available after October 1. Studio Co-ordinators and their members will assess what to keep, and what to tip. Kate Wall has kindly offered her trailer to assist in transport of items to the tip and will advise dates when available.

# **MACS Building 3**

The Landlords have advised that fixtures such as kitchen cupboards, sink and hot water service will remain and form part of the lettable area. Men's Shed have negotiated with the Landlords to take the oven, which is part of their cooking programs. They will also remove fittings such as the fridge, microwave, appliances, cupboard contents and furniture.

The landlords also advised Building 3 will be getting a new roof and insulation. A date for the work is not yet fixed but will be after October. They envisage the interruption will be short and members advised when it takes place. The breezeway will be kept as part of MACS space. MACS will use our own tables and furniture. Members to be advised of the dates for working bees.

Colin Macauley attended to answer any questions Members may have had regarding the change.

#### **Boats Afloat and Working Bee for Boards and Plinths**

The Boats Afloat Committee will shortly confirm our participation in the event this November. Information will be distributed as soon as advised and members may be asked to participate in a working bee to paint boards and plinths.

#### **Key Register**

Fiona also wanted to remind studio groups to pay their \$2 fees each week, if forgotten one week, please pay double the following week. We rely on those fees to contribute to tea, coffee and toilet paper. From October this year this will also include milk and sugar, some electricity costs etc.

#### **Artists Commissions at the Visitor Centre**

Many MACS artists display and sell work at the Narooma Visitor Centre, sales continue to average \$1,200 per month.

Although some artists volunteer at the Visitor Centre it is not compulsory and there are many other opportunities for members to contribute to MACS and the arts community.

All MACS Artists who contribute will continue to pay 20% commission at the Visitor Centre and other exhibition spaces organised by MACS.

Other MACS Artists who do not contribute, will pay 30% from October 1st.

The Committee understands not everyone can help and we were looking to raise the commission for all members. This is a compromise solution and ensures that those who contribute benefit the most. We understand there are reasons why members cannot do more, but we are heavily reliant on volunteers to remain sustainable.

MACS also introduced and welcomed new Treasurer Cally Hannah to the members present.
