Workshop Coordinator



We have received plenty of quality entries for our MACS Art on Parade Exhibition September 18 - 27.

Works will be displayed in seven prominent shop windows in midtown Narooma.

The participating shops are Eurobodalla Bathrooms and Tiles, Narooma Footwear, Silly Willys, Ezyprint, Mitre 10, the Hair Room and the Yoga Studio.

We are very grateful to these businesses for allowing us to use their window space.

The windows will be set up a couple of days before the event and participating artists advised where to deliver their artwork.





MACS member Zoe Burke will be dressing all the windows to show off the artworks at their best. She will also be leading tours of the shops in the evenings as a separate event in the River of Art.

The MACS studio will be open to the public for 3 mornings during the festival. Other arty happenings in our area include art exhibitions, video installations and music in the Tilba Winery, Tilba Hall and the Dromedary Hotel.

Video installations will also be shown in the Bend and Sip Coffee and Wine Bar in Narooma, and at the Visitor Information Centre, which will feature "Portraits of Resilient Youth" by Amy Spurgeon. Check out all events on the River of Art website.


NEWS FROM Other Organisations
