



Information about COVID-19

There are currently no locations in NSW associated with a confirmed COVID-19 case. It is important to follow NSW Health advice. If you are directed to get tested for COVID-19 or self-isolate by NSW Health at any time, you must follow this advice whether or not the venue or exposure setting is listed on this website.

Victoria COVID-19 case locations

There are COVID-19 case locations in Victoria. If you have been to Melbourne recently, please visit the <u>Victorian Government website</u> and, if you were at these places at the relevant times, follow the associated health advice.

If you visited Melbourne Airport Terminal 1, Tullamarine Airport, between 7:00pm – 7:30pm on 21 April 2021, you are a casual contact. After arriving in NSW, or if you are already in NSW, you must:

- immediately travel to your place of residence or another suitable place
- <u>get tested</u> and <u>self-isolate</u> until you receive a negative result.

COVID-19 virus fragments detected in

sewage

If you live in any of the below areas you should monitor for <u>symptoms</u>. If you have even the mildest of symptoms (even if it appears to be a cold), <u>get</u> tested and self-isolate immediately.

Allambie Heights sewage network (sampled 22 and 26 April 2021)

The Allambie Heights sewage network serves about 83,400 people in the Northern Head catchment, and includes the suburbs of Allambie Heights, Balgowlah, Curl Curl, North Curl Curl, North Manly, Freshwater, Collaroy, Collaroy Plateau, Narrabeen, Wheeler Heights, Oxford Falls, Dee Why, Cromer, Beacon Hill, Narraweena, Brookvale, Frenchs Forest.

Burwood Beach sewage treatment plant (sampled 21 April 2021)

The Burwood Beach catchment has about 225,000 people and takes in the Newcastle City area and the surrounding suburbs of Dudley, Charlestown, Jesmond, Lambton, New Lambton, Mayfield, Elermore Vale, Wallsend, Kotara, Garden Suburb, Adamstown Heights, Kahibah, Highfields, Merewether, Waratah West, Georgetown and Carrington.

Merimbula sewage treatment plant sampled 21 April 2021)

The Merimbula sewage treatment plant serves about 15,000 people on the South Coast.

Vaccination totals

Vaccine doses administered by NSW Health notified in the past 24 hours, to 8pm 3 May 2021. Includes first and second doses. NSW Health's vaccination clinics generally operate Monday to Friday. Therefore, there are a limited number of vaccines administered on weekend days and public holidays due to planned closures.

215,006 total vaccinations since 22 February 2021

3,984 total vaccinations in the past 24 hours to 8pm 3 May 2021

Check to see if you can book a COVID-19 vaccination yet. You can do this for yourself or another person.

In our rollout, COVID-19 vaccines will be available in phases. Groups of people get the vaccination at different times.

The groups are Phase 1a, Phase 1b, Phase 2a, Phase 2b and Phase 3.

COVID-19 vaccination: information for the NSW community

Who is responsible for delivering the

COVID-19 vaccination program?

The Australian Government is responsible for securing and distributing the COVID-19 vaccines and overseeing the national COVID-19 vaccination strategy. The NSW Government is collaborating with the Australian Government to implement the COVID-19 vaccination plan in NSW.

What should I do now?

It is important to continue to protect yourself and others against COVID-19. Even when the vaccine starts to be administered to the general community in NSW, it will still be important to practise COVID safe behaviour:

- Stay 1.5m apart from people you don't live with
- Wash your hands regularly
- Get tested immediately and self-isolate if you have any COVID-19 symptoms
- Wear a face mask when you can't physically distance, especially in indoor settings
- Choose outdoor settings to gather with others wherever possible
- Keep up to date with the latest COVID-19 case locations and information in NSW through the <u>NSW Government website</u>.
