A big welcome to Kitty Ryan

Kitty is the new MACS Secretary and we asked her about her journey. Here in her own words is her narrative.

I have been intending to join MACS for a long time now. When I retired to Narooma the second thing I did (first was to join the golf club) was sign up for art classes when it was in the Kinema along with the library. Things have changed a lot in twentytwo years!

Art didn't work out so well as I joined Bermagui Golf Club as well (I was full of beans then) and the time didn't allow for all my ambitions.

There isn't a craft or art pursuit that I haven't given a red-hot go. I was in Dalmeny Quilters too and made quite a few quilts but there is a limit to how many you do so that petered out.

Mostly though, I create on my own and learn a lot from tutorials on the internet.

I am adding to my skills all the time and I know I will be inspired by all the activity that is clearly taking place in MACS.

My word processing skills I can vouch for having spent seven years as Development Secretary in Holroyd Council (now Cumberland after amalgamating with several others to form a super Council) in Sydney and prior to that worked in the Radiology department in Randwick hospital as a medical transcriptionist.

I am well known up and down the FSC through golf, and locally from volunteering in St Vincent de Paul, dog park and walks and general out and about stuff. I love eating out.

We arrived in Australia on 24th January 1992 (our third time migrating) with the last of our family – two teenage girls, one with two years of high school left to complete. I am eternally grateful that we made Australia our home and not America, as that was a consideration, but that is a story for another day.

To explain the three times migration from our native home Ireland – my soon to be husband arrived in Australia in 1959 from Tipperary in the Republic of Ireland and six months later I travelled to Sydney from Belfast Northern Ireland and arrived in Sydney in 1960. We met in the Gaelic Club in Sydney in 1961 and married in Ireland in 1962.

We migrated to Australia again in 1969 to 1971 from New Zealand and then 1992 to present.

Ireland measures 300 miles long by 200 miles across but the chances of meeting there were nil. So, I travelled 12000 miles to meet my soulmate who sadly died suddenly in 2017.

I hope that this outline of my life will be expanded upon as I get to know the members of MACS in the coming months and I am looking forward to meeting all of you soon.

Materials list

1 stretched canvases. The shape will depend on the composition of your subjects. Be realistic in the sizes that you tackle.

Oil Colours (I prefer Winsor & Newton Artist Quality but bring what you have). The list below is a guide only. You do not have to buy everything – but bring what you have and include any other colours you might wish to use.

Winsor Green (or Pthalo Green)

Sap Green Olive Green

Cerulean Blue French Ultra Cobalt Turquoise

Cadmium Lemon (or Lemon Yellow)

Yellow Ochre Naples Yellow

Purple Madder Magenta

White (Winton Soft Mixing) Burnt Sienna Ivory black Burnt Umber

Medium: Archival Classic and Liquin Fine Detail

Brushes

Bring your favourite brushes. The list below shows what I use For drawing and fine detail choose one of the following:

Masking Tape Paper Towels Easel

LARGE Palette -

I use white painted masonite available from hardware stores. Size around 45 $\,$

x 70 cm or you can use throw away artists paper pallettes that can be taped

to the table

Reference Photos -

make sure these are clear, large enough to work from and have a good play of light and dark. If you are doing your own printing from a computer, make

sure that you use photo quality paper NOT plain paper.

Now in its 10th year, the Basil Sellers Art Prize cements Eurobodalla's support of the arts, not only in south east NSW but Australia-wide.

In 2022 the competition became nationwide with an increased major prize of \$30,000. The Eurobodalla Award of \$5,000 will continue to support local artists and the People's Choice winner will receive \$500.

The major prize continues to be generously supported by businessman and philanthropist, Mr Basil Sellers AM. The winning artwork is acquired and placed into his extensive private art collection. The Eurobodalla award is supported by Eurobodalla Shire Council and will be acquired and added to Council's permanent art collection. Additionally, the artist winning the Eurobodalla award will have the opportunity for a solo exhibition in the Bas in 2023.

2022 winners announced

Congratulations to Michael Thomson on winning the Basil Sellers Art Prize major award of \$25,000, with his work An Encounter on the Path that Leads to the River.

Local artist Gillian Wilde took out the Eurobodalla Award of \$5,000 and the opportunity of a solo show at the Bas in 2023.

Wonga and the Waratah is a large-scale installation that presents a local dreamtime story in an immersive visual form.

Conceived and designed by preeminent Eurobodalla artist, Cheryl Davison, the project has engaged the community in making and presenting this poignant local narrative.

Enter the world of Wonga the pigeon and trace her journey back to her nest after her encounter with a hawk. Hopping from flower-to-flower Wonga turns each flower red with blood from her broken wing.

Cheryl is a Walbunja, Ngarigo woman who lives and works on the Far South Coast of New South Wales. Growing up, Cheryl felt privileged to be around many of her Elders and the community, listening to stories of the Yuin people. Studying and teaching visual arts, graphic arts and printmaking has provided her the foundations that have shaped her life and fostered the artist and storyteller she is today.

Cheryl exhibits nationally and internationally and is a dedicated advocate of her community and culture, her distinctive style and unique way of storytelling is immediately recognisable.
