"The launch on Monday 30th January of the Government's National Cultural Policy had a great sense of expectation. Despite working to an ambitious timeframe to complete the task of presenting a policy in a 6 month process (it actually took 7 months) the sector was very much awaiting the outcome.

For all of us packed into the iconic music venue the Espy in St Kilda for the launch, the policy as presented by both the Prime Minister Anthony Albanese and the Arts Minister Tony Burke, did not disappoint.

Its name, *Revive*, says a lot about their intentions to recalibrate the approach to respond to current issues and re-think the priorities.

In 2023 Regional Arts Australia will celebrate 80 years since being established in 1943 as the Council for the Encouragement of Music.

For 80 years, Regional Arts Australia has been facilitating opportunities, increasing access, maintaining collaborative relationships, and providing timely support to celebrate Australian stories across art forms and across landscapes.

To celebrate they are launching their Pledge a Dot initiative to secure the future of Regional Arts Australia. The campaign seeks to raise \$1 million to increase core capacity in the delivery of support for arts in regional Australia. They are also aiming to Sponsor a Regional Artist Residency in a new strategic program providing income for 80 artists in year-long community-based residencies across regional Australia.

EXPLORE COURSES AT BATEMANS BAY TAFE

When you choose your course, you may notice a button that prompts you to either Enrol Now, Apply Now or Enquire Now. These buttons change depending on your course choice. We've put together this guide to help you know what to expect.

BEFORE YOU START


There are a few things you'll need to do before you can start your enrolment or application.

- 1. Check if your course has entry requirements. You can find these when you choose your course and your campus location. You'll need to provide evidence for entry requirements, so make sure you have this ready to go.
- 2. You'll need a Unique Student Identifier (USI). If you don't have your USI handy, you can search for it, or if you've never had one you can create one. Want to find out more about your USI or how to create one? Watch this video.
- Check your course fees. If you would like to apply for a fee concession or exemption, you'll need to meet the eligibility requirements. Read more about <u>fee concession or exemption</u>.

 If you are a visa holder, there may be <u>visa</u> <u>conditions</u> related to studying with TAFE NSW. Please have your visa evidence available before you enrol.

Group exhibition | Speaking Water 11 February - 12 March

Speaking Water is a series of collaborations and video works created by five international award-winning contemporary female artists.

Featuring works by:

- Simone Hooymans
- Anna Glynn
- Jasmine Cederqvist
- Emily Jay
- Anastasia Savinova.

The exhibition contemplates the journey of water through time from ancient ice and glaciers, through rivers, waves, and seas, to the clouds and rains, to living things composed of water. An amazing cycle where tears may return as the swirling mist on a distant mountain top.

The works are interwoven with recurring imagery and sound overlapping; a watery journey and expedition. Composed of animation, experimental video, performance, and more, the series ebbs and flows just as water does.

Artist profiles

Since early 2021 the featured artists have shared online conversations discussing aspects of the world they inhabit and what they have been experiencing. These conversations inspired artworks about how connected these artists truly are, and how such connections exist and evolve through time and space.

As water resonated thematically with the artists and their previous artistic explorations, it became the central motif for exploring and strengthening their connection.

Art exhibition - Ward and Wilde - Birds of a Feather

This exhibition presents the work of two artists, Mark Ward and Gillian Wilde, responding to their passionate interest in birds. The work is connected thematically although has wonderfully diverse approaches. There is also an element of whimsy, which allows further reflection on our appreciation of birds at this time of environmental change.

Mark Ward's work compromises of oil painting, assemblage, lino-cut print and free-standing sculpture. Gillian Wilde's bold engaging images on paper are an exploration of birds through hand-dyed ink paper collage and watercolour.

Artist profiles

Both artists have been friends of the Bas for many years. Ward was part of the first project under the banner Bas About Town - Makers and Spacers project and Wilde was the 2022 Eurobodalla Prize Winner as part of the Basil Sellers Art Prize.
