

Introducing – Lucia Dale/Barrimore



I am Lucia Barrimore (formal qualifications include **B.A. Hons.1, Dip. Ed.** Visual Arts, **Diploma Fine Arts).**

I have been involved with Visual and Performing Arts all of my life, as I grew up in a family of respected artists.

I attended East Sydney Technical College and later the Northern Rivers College of Education (now part of University of New England) Visual Arts courses. I later completed my Education degree to teach Visual Art at Wollongong University. My enthusiasm for drawing began from the age of four, when I was given old brown paper bags on which to draw giraffes, elephants, horses – animals which fascinated me so much! My father at that time had a pottery studio, and he would occasionally give me any 'reject' pottery on which I was allowed to 'draw' shapes or scenes as decoration - which kept me engaged for hours!

A love of creative processes naturally flowed on from

However, even before obtaining my Education Degrees; I had been involved in many activities: I organised and hung Gallery exhibitions; designed and made backdrops; stage sets for theatrical performances, and made costumes and masks for Dance performances. I also designed and made community murals, silk screen prints, banners, painted placards, etc.

Now, after years of experience, I realise at the core of all successful Visual Arts techniques is the experience of the practice of Drawing!

Through the practice of Drawing we develop our perception, our ability to see objects and their surrounding spaces in heightened focus – and from that develops an appreciation, wonder and love of those 'objects', which extends to the world around us.

Perhaps one may argue that Drawing might be beneficial as a superior meditative technique?!!

Course Outline for Introductory Group Drawing Programme Lucia Barrimore

Lesson One.

Introduction:

Discuss varieties of drawing implements effects of grounds (colours/textures) and tools – demonstrate. Show examples, e.g. charcoal, pencil, coloured chalks, pen & ink, etc.

Discuss methods of shading techniques - show examples. [approx. 15 mins]

2. Exercises:

A. Object Drawing -Choose 1 implement & ground.

Quick sketches (2 mins): e.g. a. bottles, b. basket, c. cup



B. Choose different mediums and repeat similar exercise as above.

C. Compare differences/effects. [approx. 20 mins]

3. Single-line drawing no looking at paper/ no lifting of pen

Quick sketches (1-2 mins): e.g.

- a) teapot, positioned at different angles.
- b) chair "
- c) students take turns to pose, stand or sit [approx. 20 mins] (total= approx. 1 hour)

BREAK

4. Objects from living things: e.g. branches, plants, shells, bones

Each student has one object and selects the implements to best capture the 'essence', from their personal perspective, of that particular object.

Experiment with shading technique. (5-10 mins)

Change objects and adjust to experimenting with different drawing materials and techniques to suit. (5-10 mins)

[approx. 20+ mins]

Exercise: a) Students select one of their objects to create a repeat design, e.g. to make a border around a page

b) Try a different design

[approx. 20+ mins]

Drawing Program Cont.....

5. Major Drawing Exercise:

Final work: an ensemble of objects drawn inside a page, incorporating a decorative border design on at least one side.

[approx. 30+ mins]

Featured Artist at Cobargo Creators Gallery 27 February to 11 March, 2023



A brief profile:



Election fever was kicked off by a special visit from the Minister for Tourism, Aboriginal Affairs, Arts and Regional Youth, The Hon. Benjamin Franklin MLC to our office, capping off a productive two-day session amongst RADO Executive Directors.

RANSW has been involved in conversations spanning the political divide, at all governmental levels. We've fielded calls from the Office of the Arts in Canberra and from the NSW Greens in the last few days alone.

THE 2023 FESTIVAL HAS GOT YOU COVERED!

Four Winds Music Festival returns to Barragga Bay this Easter for three days of exceptional music in beautiful bushland surrounds.

Grounded by voices carrying the world's oldest music traditions through to those of today, the Four Winds Music Festival features iconic European composers including Vivaldi, Prokofiev and Stravinsky, alongside those from Sweden, Iceland and Germany. The sound of American Aaron Copland carries listeners across the Pacific where African American Coleridge Taylor-Perkinson broke ground across almost every musical medium, and his compatriots Caroline Shaw and Sarah Kirkland Snider who explore spoken word were influenced by Pulitzer voices and The Odyssey.

Bringing these works to life are the best of Australia's classical and contemporary musicians coming to the Sapphire Coast of NSW, as part of an expansive line-up that maintains Four Winds' unwavering commitment to quality featuring:

Speaking Water is a series of collaborations and video works created by five international award-winning contemporary female artists.

Featuring works by:

- Simone Hooymans
- Anna Glynn
- Jasmine Cederqvist
- Emily Jay
- Anastasia Savinova.

The exhibition contemplates the journey of water through time from ancient ice and glaciers, through rivers, waves, and seas, to the clouds and rains, to living things composed of water. An amazing cycle where tears may return as the swirling mist on a distant mountain top.

The works are interwoven with recurring imagery and sound overlapping; a watery journey and expedition. Composed of animation, experimental video, performance, and more, the series ebbs and flows just as water does.

Artist profiles

Since early 2021 the featured artists have shared online conversations discussing aspects of the world they inhabit and what they have been experiencing. These conversations inspired artworks about how connected these artists truly are, and how such connections exist and evolve through time and space.

As water resonated thematically with the artists and their previous artistic explorations, it became the central motif for exploring and strengthening their connection.
