#### President's Report



Welcome back everyone to yet another month of great productivity.

Our members are busy working on their artworks and the numbers in weekly classes are increasing.

The pottery group continues to grow and is really good to see.

I would like to include in this Newsletter an explanation of how our weekly \$3 studio fees are allocated.

When MACS managed the Visitor Information Centre (VIC) for Council we were able to use profits to subsidise services for members - and to build a healthy bank balance.

Now our main income source is membership, studio fees, and commissions from workshops and exhibitions sales.

MACS is self-funding and not subsidised. The current budget manages all expenses - rent, electricity, heating, insurance, as well as consumables such as tea/coffee, cleaning supplies, etc. The \$3 studio fee is part of that budget and allows MACS to maintain the present low annual fee.

MACS tutors and convenors volunteer their time and expertise, and other members volunteer to ensure MACS is managed efficiently and meets its statutory obligations.

All this experience and expertise is given free of charge and ensures MACS friendly environment continues to be accessible to all.

In this same sharing spirit I am asking for volunteers from our weekly groups to help with cleaning the studio and bathroom. This can be on a roster system of, say, once a month and should not take a great deal of time to vacuum, mop, and dust.

At some stage we will also have a working bee to tidy up the studio and I will send out a notice to advise the date.

I am pleased to see that members have renewed their membership. This is important as only financial members are covered by MACS insurance.

Also pleased to see members being enthusiastic and productive in their various groups.

#### **Drawing with Lucia at MACS Studio**



Lucia's Drawing Group is a busy one and is totally immersive as you will see from the photos of some very busy attendees. Lucia is full of praise for her students output.

Hours are from 1 pm to 3 pm on Wednesday afternoons.

This course is very high quality and Lucia shares her equipment with the class, the introduction was free however a small fee will soon be introduced to help cover materials.

Lucia will advise the amount directly to her group and has made every effort to keep it affordable.

Rosy reports on her experience of attending one of Lucia's group sessions.

I attended a very interesting session to help attendees develop their preceptive skills for taking the large object to the small size and keeping it in proportion.

Lucia started with shell/plant drawings using pencil and/or charcoal and went on to figure drawing where each pupil posed for quick sketching by the others.

Photos show the drawing of the shapes first, whilst not looking at the objects as drawn!

Next, students created forms by blocking in the outlines of the object to create negative space inside to depict the subject as accurately as possible.

It was also fun for the students to model and create poses for others to work with, all done quickly. Lucia was full of encouragement and praise for all efforts and some remarkable art was produced in a short space of time!





#### **TEXTILE Tuesdays with Judy Glover**

It is so good to see this group up and running again. Big thanks to Judy Glover for lending her time and expertise. Judy demonstrates how she creates her beautiful scarves. This group is about textiles and not limited to any one medium.

#### **Introducing Tuesday Textiles:**

Judy Glover is a past President of MACS and a member for many years, she enjoys passing on her expertise and stylish creativity.

Textiles has now recommenced at MACS studios on Tuesdays at 10am.

I do Nuno Felting to make interesting scarves. Nuno felting is a form of wet felting using open weave silk gauze or tissue and merino wool roving to make cloth.

Nuno is the Japanese word for cloth. The Nuno felting method lends itself to making light and airy wraps to wear.

The felting is accomplished by the addition of water, heat, soap and friction to the wool. This allows you to make one-off designs.

Bubble wrap is used for the friction and foam noodles help the rolling process. The wool adheres to the silk to eventually end up as a light cloth.

Once your piece of artwork is completed and rolled until it adheres; you then shock the fabric by a method called fulling. This helps bring out the wrinkles and creases in the fabric and can be fun to do. You throw your piece from a height to the floor to shock the fabric. I usually do this at least 100 times and the actual rolling of the fabric about 400 to 500 times.

Suzanne Moore comes along too on Tuesdays.
Suzanne is interested in sewing and MACS have several sewing machines and an overlocker which can be used.

Wendy Ezendam also attends and is learning new skills. New members are most welcome to join us for knitting, embroidery, and other textile arts.

Take me where the April sun is gonna treat me....so right.



The exhibition explores the compelling history of steamship navigation in the region and the enormous significance of maritime industry's contribution to the development of the South Coast and hinterland.


