
Rosy spoke to Judy Gordon re how excited her Mosaic group are getting with many Member works being readied for the Exhibition... Sept 15 -17th.

Here is a work in Progress by keen lead-lighting artist, Cheryl Hill.


Bob's group meets every second Monday at the Studio, with their tools and design ideas for our Coastal Life theme, come and have a look!




#### Welcome to our August eNews.




# EARLY BIRD TICKETS ARE SELLING FAST! Headland Writers Festival returns to Tathra from 27-29 October 2023
