



New Round of Quick Response Grants


Grant season never ends at Regional Arts NSW! Despite the Regional Arts Fund closing for the year, Quick Response Grants remain open.

Quick Reponses Grants are specifically for projects or opportunities that are unable to be planned for or supported in other funding rounds. For example, professional/skills development or a small project that has come up on short notice.

Individuals can apply for up to \$3000, organisations can apply for up to \$5000 though the funding pool is very limited so make sure your budgets are accurate and you're only applying for the amount you need.

Projects must begin 2 -12 weeks after the closing date (31st October for this round). Applicants will be advised in writing of your application no more than 5 business days after the closing date.
