




Mermaid Sculpture by Donna Goulding exhibited in the Narooma Gallery Exhibition



For 20 years the Arts Trail has been the heart of the River of Art Festival showcasing diverse art forms including visual arts, music, dance, performance art, installations and workshops.

The 2024 Festival will feature the treasured Arts Trail that encourages people to visit open studios and galleries along the NSW South Coast to view art and meet artists in their studios. The Trail also features workshops where visitors can come and boost their creativity and learn new techniques from the many skilled artists.

We want to see shopfronts, businesses, clubs, pubs, nooks, crannies, spaces and places across the region bursting with art, sound, music, dance, performance and fun!

If you have a studio, gallery, or shopfront or offer workshops or performances please submit your entry below.

Funding for the arts in Australia is more stretched than ever. A greater number of artists and organisations compete for a diminishing pool of government and corporate support and many well-known festivals have cancelled or 'paused' for 2024.

This year we are introducing a registration fee for all program entries. We need to help cover the costs of running the Festival including marketing and venues. We have not and will not charge a commission for Arts Trail participants.

The fees are as follows: \$30 per individual artist \$30 plus \$10 for each artist if doing a group show to a max of \$100 \$125 for an organisation

Inclusion in the Program is open for all artists, makers, performers, musicians and venues in the Eurobodalla shire and complimentary Artist profiles will be added to our Arts Directory.

Kil.n.it Experimental Ceramics Studio is delighted to announce a fully funded residency exchange program for makers who work with ceramics. This groundbreaking initiative, generously funded by Create NSW and supported by our partners at Bandicoot Pottery, South East Arts, and the South East Centre for Contemporary Art, will involve a series of workshops, events, residencies, and exhibitions. The program aims to foster collaboration between Kil.n.it's Sydney-based artists and the South-East Regional arts community. An EOI for artists from the south east interested in the residency opportunity is NOW OPEN - submissions due by 30 July.



'Heather Burness: A Time of Concentration'. Showing until 11 September at SECCA, Bega.

Burness is an Australian artist working in unconventional print-based processes, drawing and web-based photography. Her work has focused on ephemeral phenomena and the experience of 'place', engaging with selected sites (in Australia and overseas) through in-field installations of mild steel plates within the environment. The plates capture the marks of transient micro events such as the flow of water, mist, low-lying clouds, fog, shorelines, groundwater, rivers, soils, atmospheric conditions, and the meeting of fresh and saltwater. These later become printing surfaces for works-on-paper in her studio.
