The dates on the MACS Art Exhibition Conditions of Entry form need adjustment. The updated form will be re-sent with this Newsletter.


Final date for Entry Forms is the 20th September. If you need an extension please let me know.

Literary and Art Salon at Moruya Library By Gary Caldow

Eurobodalla Literary and Art Salons October 2024

Hi Rosie, here is a short explanation of the Literary and Art Salons held at Moruya Library in October.

"Each year the Eurobodalla Literary and Art Salons are held at the Moruya Library to showcase artists and Writers works. Some months before the event a writer is matched with an Artist and the writer then usually visits the artist's studio to peruse the various works. A painting is chosen to be the background to a new story which is composed by the writer and presented to the artist on most occasions, ahead of the presentation evening.

Art works are displayed in the library two weeks before the presentation evening. During this evening, writers present their short stories with the artwork as a backdrop. The artist then gives a short speech to discuss their ideas behind the work and to comment on the short story.

Last year Indigenous artist Rhonda Casey from Cobargo chose Gary's painting "KIMBERLEY REMEMBERED" and this year Claude Monzo from Potato Point has chosen "MYSTERY at MYSTERY BAY" (shown) as the subject of his thrilling short story.

Gary and Claude will present on 24 October at 5:30 PM at the Moruya Library to an anticipated packed audience."

Let me know if you'd like to drop in.



Celia Gullett - SHAPING COLOUR at SECCA until 18 September

These lyrical works are a testament to the artist's love of colour in its purest forms. Her works are sensitive, responsive, and highly considered, drawing inspiration from the aesthetic markers in the world around her: the light of storm clouds, the luminous bands of fishing floats, the pink of an elephant's inner ear.

The full unveiling of the work requires time and asks a pause from the viewer. They speak of mediative states.



Heather Burness - A TIME OF CONCENTRATION. On exhibit at SECCA until 11 Sept 2024.

For the artist, the creative process is one intrinsically linked to field work. Through the durational process she uses, of exposing the metal printmaking plates in situ to the environment, the artist stewards the opening of windows for the sensibilities of industrial material to capture physical and chemical forces inherent to the local site, "She provides a unique record of the forces of nature that constantly encompass us that we cannot see. Through her process of printmaking, working with materiality and using the language of abstraction, Burness tests the possibilities of collaboration with nature to bring into consciousness these vital forces."


Shop7 ArtSpace Gallery, Upperdeck, Bermagui Fishermens Wharf


