



NEWS FROM SOUTH EAST ARTS


Welcome to our happy Summer edition for the final enews of 2024.

One of Australia's most loved and richest awards for realistic portraiture, the biennial Shirley



Hannan National Portrait Award returns to the Bega Valley for the first time at the newly opened South East Centre for Contemporary Art.

Celebrating portraiture in memory of the dedicated arts patron and supporter, Shirley Hannan, the \$50,000 biennial award is nonacquisitive and attracts hundreds of entries from many of Australia's most respected artists. A prerequisite for the award was made that those works selected to hang depict their subjects accurately without abstraction and demonstrate a sound skill and knowledge of drawing and painting technique.

The exhibition of finalists will be on show until Saturday 01 February 2025.

The 2024 River of Art Festival was an unforgettable celebration of 20 years of artistic expression and community spirit.

Thanks to everyone who helped with feedback on the Festival. We were so delighted to see great ratings and ideas for next year. As we plan the 2025 Festival, we'll certainly take your suggestions on board.

We have consolidated all the information and produced our Outcomes Report on the Festival and reviewed the event report prepared by Council. The standouts:

The Festival launch and River of Art Prize

Stunning performance of Baranguba by the Djaadjawan Dancers that incorporated traditional storytelling with modern technology

50 open studios and galleries forming the Arts Trail from Durras to Bermagui Town celebrations – bringing Mogo and Bodalla to life with creative activities

The report shows a boost to visitors with 15,667 people attending Festival events. A huge appreciation of the talent and creativity of South Coast artists. The total spend across the Eurobodalla was a stunning \$30.2m towards the local economy, and importantly 98% of you said you'd come back next year.




