



Country Arts Support Program (CASP), Opens 1 November 2024South East Arts is offering arts groups, organisations and LGAs the opportunity to apply for funding to the Country Arts Support Program to support projects within the South East Arts service region.

CASP can be accessed by artists' groups or collectives, notfor-profit organisations, museums, and galleries. Local Government can also apply where Council offers a cocontribution of 50% or greater.

The 2024 Round is to support projects that will take place in 2025, between the date range of 1 February to 31 December 2025. **MORE INFO HERE**

On Saturday 19 October as part of the Headland Writers Festival, Claire Aman was announced as the Winner of the Olga Masters Short Story Award 2024 for her story, Ishbel.



Gordon Hookey: A MURRIALITY. Showing at SECCA until 13 Nov

'A MURRIALITY' is the first survey of renowned Waanyi artist Gordon Hookey, charting three decades of practice where artmaking and activism fuse.

Gordon Hookey's work is best known for its biting satire of Australian culture and politics, its witty critique of racism, and an exploration of oral and image-based history-making traditions. Across sculpture, printmaking, video, and large-scale painting, 'A MURRIALITY' presents perspectives on historical and contemporary issues affecting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. Through the lens of Hookey's lived experience as a Murri person, this includes legal injustices, international conflict, cultural representations, and language



Regional Arts Fund Quick Response Grant rounds are open monthly from February to November, funding up to \$3,000 for individuals and \$5,000 for organisations is available

The program supports short notice opportunities that are unable to be planned for or supported in other

funding rounds, and projects must begin 2 - 12 weeks after the closing date of the round you are applying in.

can't wait to explore and meet the thriving South East Arts creative community




From CreateNSW // We're excited to announce that five new Arts and Cultural Funding Program - Project and Multi-year funding rounds have opened!

Individual creative practitioners and arts and cultural organisations in NSW can now apply for:

- Creative Nations projects for First Nations organisations and individuals small project grants up to \$40,000; large project grants up to \$100,000
- Next Steps professional and skills development (for individuals) grants up to \$10,000
- Creative Steps new work development (for individuals) small project grants up to \$40,000; large project grants up to \$100,000
- Cultural Access projects by organisations and individuals that engages with NSW Government strategic priority areas small project grants up to \$40,000; large project grants up to \$100,000
- 4-Year Multi-Year Not-for-profit arts and cultural organisations, service organisations or local government authorities with a primary purpose on arts and cultural activity. Applicants can apply for a minimum of \$100,000 and a maximum of \$600,000 each year



The exhibition will be on until Wednesday the 27th of November, 2024.


The Gallery is upstairs at the Bermagui Wharf, and is open from 10.30 till 3 every day except Tuesday.
