
The 10th Candelo Village Festival is Coming, Saturday March 29th. All day – Late. William St, Candelo, Bega Valley



Selected finalists will have the opportunity to pitch their projects to a panel of industry judges, with the recipient to receive development funding and support to refine their script and take their concept to market.

Teams can consist of up to three creatives, with at least one based in regional Australia.



You have until Tuesday 6 April to apply for grants of up to \$1,000 for NAIDOC Week activities celebrating Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander history, culture and achievement.

Past grants have been used for Aboriginal flag-raising ceremonies, storytelling, sports and games, displays of cultural artifacts, language programs, art and craft demonstrations, bush tucker gardens, and murals.
