
Moorish Morocco Tour – April 2026


As part of the River of Art Festival – Art on Parade, I'll be the guest artist at The Art Room Narooma with a special studio sale and farewell exhibition.

The exhibition will be judged by well known south coast artist Sue Chancellor.





Feathered Open Art Prize Exhibition


